



The challenge faced by Namibia today is that domestic energy generation is not adequate to meet current and future projected energy demand. Therefore, government has to take an urgent policy decision on how to reform the energy sector to meet Namibia's rising demand. The programme is intended to give information on the close interconnection between the different ways of energy production – conventional energy sources, renewable energies and nuclear power -, the protection of the environment and the mitigation of climate change. We believe that these topics are closely related and decisions on how to produce Namibia's energy demand need careful consideration because of repercussions to the environment of the people.

In order to enable young Namibians to participate in the process of influencing Namibia's energy sector and to create civil awareness in their respective communities, the following training programme is offered:

Training young Namibians on the energy sector – sustainable options to meet Namibia's rising energy demand

Minimum requirements

Grade 12 plus some knowledge and/or experience related to the topic
Must be between 20 and 35 years

Skills

Verbal and written communication skills in English
Self motivated, determined, good speaker and willing to do voluntary work
Good networking skills

CV not longer than two pages,
an assignment on the topic "How do you envisage Namibia's energy sector in 10 years time"?
in not more than 600 words
