Keynote Speaker:

Prof. Dr. Michael Cichon holds a Master's degree in Pure and Applied Mathematics (Technical University, Aachen, Germany), a Master's degree in Public Administration (Harvard University) and a PhD in Economics (University of Göttingen, Germany).

He joined the International Labour Organization (ILO) in 1986 as senior actuary and health economist. Between 1992 and 1995 he served as social security specialist on the ILO advisory team for Central and Eastern Europe in Budapest. Between 1995 and 2005 he was the Chief of the Financial, Actuarial and Statistical Services Branch of the ILO's Social Security Department. He was appointed Director of the Social Security Department in May 2005.

In July 2013, he was appointed as a honorary professor in Social Protection at the United Nations University –Maastricht Economic and Social Research Institute on Innovation and Technology (UNU-MERIT)/School of Governance, in Maastricht in the south of The Netherlands.
