Winning Regions:

- U17 Netball: Oshana and Erongo Regions

Winning Schools:

- **26 schools** from the Oshana, Erongo and //Kharas Regions represented the regional winners of the 2019 Bridging the Gap games.
- Each school won sports gear and equipment to the value of N\$10 000 by virtue of it being the school of the winning players, irrespective of the number of players from that particular school.

Winners Individual Players:

- **46 scholars** (20 girls and 26 boys) won individual prizes.
- Each player in the winning teams (for both netball and football) will receive sports gear valued at N\$1 000.

Congratulations to the winning players, schools and the coaches, trainers and mentors – they all deserve a hearty round of applause!

Ladies and gentlemen. This investment did not only benefit young girls and boys from all 14 Regions of Namibia, but it had far-reaching economic benefits for communities as well. Ongwediva in the Oshana Region was the host town of the **Bridging the Gap** finals. As such, our procurement strategy specifically procured sports equipment and services were sourced locally thereby allowing local SME's to benefit from providing services to over 500 school children who partook in the **Bridging the Gap**.
