

Day 4

Visit to Sossusvlei

Today we get up before sunrise. We experience the trip to Sossusvlei in a fascinating dream landscape. Since the sun is still quite low after sunrise, the high sand dunes on one side shimmer golden, yellow and reddish, but on the other side are dark and shady. Thus, the dune ridge stands out razor sharp. After the sightseeing of Sossusvlei and Deadvlei we might want to climb the "Big Daddy"? It is one of the highest sand dunes in the world with a height of about 300 meters and a big challenge! Before we leave the park, we visit the Sesriem Canyon. Afterwards we drive north to the Rostock Ritz Desert Lodge. We can relax at the swimming pool and at sunset take a little hike around the local mountain.

Day 5

Drive to the Atlantic coast

After breakfast we are well strengthened to tackle the Gaub- and Kuiseb Canyon and the central Namib Desert. On the way we will see ostriches, maybe springboks, zebras and oryx antelopes. Via Walvis Bay we drive to Swakopmund and move into our room in the Beach Lodge, directly on the beach. In the afternoon we can explore the coastal city or take a walk along the beach.

Day 6

Catamaran-Boat cruise

Early in the morning we drive to Walvis Bay and undertake a very interesting "Dolphin & Seal Cruise" with the catamaran. We will certainly see hundreds of seals, possibly dolphins, pelicans and flamingos. We can enjoy some fresh local oysters and sparkling wine. In the afternoon we have time to look around in Swakopmund, to shop or to try a cake in one of the German cafés. It is certainly worthwhile to visit the

museum, where the history and the different cultures of Namibia are presented very vividly. Also, the sea aquarium and the snake park are interesting.

Day 7

Via Uis to Twyfelfontein

We say goodbye to the sea and drive inland to Uis. With a view of the Brandberg, Namibia's highest mountain, we drive to Twyfelfontein Country Lodge in Damaraland. The name Twyfelfontein is Afrikaans and means "doubtful spring". The spring lies at the foot of a huge sandstone massif. In the afternoon we visit the rock engravings at Twyfelfontein and make a short detour to the Burnt Mountain and the Organ Pipes.

Day 8

Drive to the Ugab Terraces

Today we experience a very special Nature Elephant Drive in the dry riverbed of the Aba-Huab and the Huab. Between high camel thorn and white acacia trees we drive in the deep river sand and hope to spot some of the rare desert elephants.

Afterwards we leave Twyfelfontein and drive to the "Petrified Forest", where we are reminded of what happened here geologically 280 million years ago. Afterwards we go to the Vingerklip Lodge. The lodge is located at the foot of the Ugab Plateau with a fantastic view from the sundowner terrace.

The Vingerklip is not far away and the landscape is very special and can be compared to the "Marlboro" area in the USA. Maybe we go for a short hike and explore the area, or we take a plunge into the swimming pools.

Day 9

Via Outjo to Etosha National Park

Today we want to head into the realm of wildlife of Etosha National Park. The park is one of the largest wildlife reserves in the world and one of the most outstanding wildlife parks in Africa. The animals are attracted by the Etosha pan, a huge depression rarely filled with rainwater. But on its edge, there are waterholes where herds of land animals and birds can be watched the whole year.

The mineral-rich water allows grasses, bushes and trees to thrive in which the game likes to hide.

Our current accommodation, Etosha Safari Lodge, is located just a few kilometres from Andersson Gate, the entrance to the park. In the afternoon we enjoy the first game drives.

Day 10

Etosha National Park

Exciting wildlife viewing awaits us in the Etosha National Park. We have the whole day to visit the various waterholes and to see wildlife such as giraffes, kudu, zebra, oryx antelope, black-faced impala, wildebeest, springbok, ostrich and with some luck even lions. Namibia has the largest population of the rare black rhinos.

Waterberg

We leave the wildlife of Etosha National Park and drive via Outjo and Otjiwarongo to the Waterberg. The Waterberg is a natural paradise with a unique vegetation. It is known for its rare mammal species, colourful bird life and its magnificent scenery. On a small hike onto the plateau we see almost all the trees and shrubs that exist in Namibia.

Drive to Windhoek

Today we drive to Okahandja, where we visit the big woodcarving market. We continue to Okapuka Ranch, just outside Windhoek. The game reserve is boasting numerous mammal species like rhino, sable- and eland-antelopes, giraffes, black wildebeest, Kudu and springbok on its 120 sq. kilometres of savannah-grassland. We can relax at the pool, review the past days and relax before the long flight tomorrow. In the late afternoon we do a last game drive.
